





SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

Maumee Police continue to staff a school resource officer at the Maumee High School and another officer at Gateway Middle School. The school resource officer assists with school discipline, truancy issues and campus security. In addition, the officer builds relationships with the students, educators, administration and provides various topical lessons in the classroom.



Speed Detection Trailer

The Maumee Police Division utilizes two mobile speed detection trailers throughout our city limits. The devices are primarily an awareness tool for the motoring public to observe their vehicle speed in comparison to the posted limit. The speed devices were deployed for 240 days each, for a total of 5760 hours.

Citizens Police Academy

The Citizens Police Academy was held at the Maumee Police Division from September 21 – November 16. CPA students met once a week for 2 hours a night to learn about crime prevention, training officers receive to serve the community, and receive instruction from Officers and the Maumee Courts about how they do their jobs.



Accidents

This was the 20th year for the School Resource Officer (SRO) Program in the City of Maumee. Officer Scott Russell worked as the primary SRO for Maumee High School. Officer Russell assisted SRO Loren Boos and SRO Cory Henson at Gateway Middle School.

Crime Prevention

SRO Russell responded to 48 calls for service during the 2022 school year. Officer Russell also received investigations from the road patrol and detective bureau for possible follow-up. Officer Russell documented incidents of a Maumee student in mental crisis and assisted on Maumee Fire EMS runs to the High School.

SRO Russell provides insight and behavioral recommendations at the discretion of the school administrators. The SRO also meets with school administrators, counselors, and students on a daily basis.

During the 2022 school year SRO Russell assisted with A.L.I.C.E drills performed at the Maumee High School, Wayne Trail Elementary school, and Union Pre-School with teachers and staff. Those A.L.I.C.E drills included building evacuations due to a perceived interior threat, lockdown and secure in place due to an external issue, and intruder attempting to gain access drills.

The use of the SRO to enforce truancy within the district allows the SRO to work with school administration to assist in getting students back to school or finding alternate learning settings for them. SRO Russell attended nineteen attendance intervention meetings during 2022 school year.

SRO Russell has been able to assist elementary school principals in situations ranging from consultations with students, safety/security issues and investigations of criminal complaints, parking complaints, and parent complaints.

The SRO has become an important resource for school administration, staff, and the students of the district. The visibility created by the SRO and the positive interaction with the staff and students of the district has continued to create a positive image of the Maumee Police Department. The SRO position has also continued to be a great tool in gathering information about criminal activity within the City of Maumee

The Maumee Police Division continues the tradition of training our officers to be the very best in the area through a plethora of training opportunities.

2022 the police division continued to provide area businesses with Active Shooter training free of charge. This training helps to create stronger bonds between the community businesses and police department.

In 2022 we hired 3 new Patrolman, who completed the 20-week field training program which is structured with specific training briefs for each day of training. The program is broken into three phases that has specific training categories that the probationary officer must be proficient in, before advancing to the next phase of training. At the conclusion of phase three, the probationary officer is shadowed, for two weeks, by the Field Training Officer, who only observes and offers no help or advice. This ensures that the probationary officer is ready to be on his/her own, before officially being released from the program.

The Division continued to get our newer officers trained as Crisis Intervention Officers through (CIT) training.

The entire Patrol Staff participated in annual Use of Force training held at the Police Department.

The entire Patrol Staff participated in MILO (Multiple Interactive Learning Objectives) training. MILO training is training for Law Enforcement Officers through simulated training.



Officers received Active School shooter training at Maumee High School to assist with school responses to active threats at the Maumee High School.

We held several firearms qualifications in multiple weapon platforms.

DARE was expanded to included 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, and 10th grade. Prevention and Community
Outreach Coordinators taught in St. Joe's, Wayne Trail, Gateway Middle School, and Maumee High
School

Safety City was held this year at Wayne Trail Elementary school.

The Bike Rodeo was held at Fairfield for the children of Maumee.

Internet safety was taught at Gateway by SRO Henson to 7th grade students.

Trunk or Treat was done at multiple locations around the City to create positive interactions with young children and the Maumee Police Division.


A recruitment team was formed to reach out to area high schools, career centers, Universities/Colleges, Police Academies, and Job Fairs to market the Maumee Police Division. A Maumee Police recruitment video was also produced and shared on social media in an effort to increase awareness of when the department is hiring and show what opportunities the Maumee Police Division provides the community and officers.

Crime Prevention Officers began giving monthly presentations for Senior Safety at the Maumee Senior Center.

Internships:

CPA:

The Citizens Police Academy was held at the Maumee Police Division from September 21 – November 16. CPA students met once a week for 2 hours a night to learn about crime prevention, training officers receive to serve the community, and receive instruction from Officers and the Maumee Courts about how they do their jobs.

High School Police Academy:

High School students from Maumee High School and area High School participated in the first ever Maumee High School Police Academy from July 5 – August 4. Students met twice a week at the Maumee Police Station for 2 hours a day. Students were shown how Maumee Police Officers handle calls for service, interact with the public, and solve crimes in the community.



MAJOR INVESTIGATIONS

Rape

There were two (2) Rape offenses investigated; both cases were unfounded.

Sexual Assault

There were eight (8) sexual assault cases investigated. Three (3) cases were cleared by arrest. Five (5) cases were unfounded

Arson

There were no arson cases investigated by the detective bureau.

Missing Persons

There were no missing person cases that required an investigation.



Robbery

There were four (4) robbery cases investigated by the detective bureau. Two (2) cases were cleared by arrest. One (1) robbery investigated was at the Pizza Hut where a suspect said he had a gun but never brandished a weapon. After a lengthy investigation, the suspect was identified by means of DNA and was subsequently indicted on an F-2 Robbery offense.

Felonious Assault

Four (4) felonious assault cases required further investigation. Three (3) were cleared by arrest and one (1) remains unsolved.

Residential Burglary

Two (2) residential burglary cases were assigned for further investigation. One (1) was cleared by arrest and one (1) remains unsolved.

Breaking and Entering

Nine (9) breaking and entering cases were investigated. Two of these cases were cleared by arrest. Six (6) cases remain unsolved and one (1) case remains under investigation.

Theft

Seventy-six (76) theft cases were assigned. Of these, seventeen (17) cases were cleared by arrest. Fifty-one (51) cases were closed due to either a lack of investigative leads, exhaustion of investigative leads, or referred to another agency due to jurisdiction/venue. Six (6) cases were unfounded. Two (2) cases from 2022 remain under investigation.

Fraud

Eleven (11) fraud cases were assigned. Of these, six (6) cases were cleared by arrest. Four (4) cases were closed due to leads being exhausted. One (1) remains under investigation.




Summary

In 2022 the detective bureau investigated a total of 174 incidents that were reported to have occurred in the City of Maumee. Of those, seven (7) remain under investigation. A total of nineteen (19) incidents were death investigations (non-criminal). Of the remaining closed cases, thirty-nine were cleared by arrest or exceptional means. Ninety-one were closed, closed due to a lack of leads, or closed due to exhaustion of investigative leads. The majority of cases assigned to the detective bureau were theft offenses (76) which totaled 48% of all investigations conducted for the year. The remaining cases were closed due to the victim failing to cooperate, the death of the offender, or prosecution being declined.

A homicide cold case which occurred in 1977 was re-opened this year. The victim was brutally murdered while in her apartment at Lake View Shores Apartments. This case was assigned after the victim's son contacted the Chief of Police on the anniversary of her death. The evidence was resubmitted to the Bureau of Criminal Investigation for DNA analysis. Detectives have interviewed several people who had ties to the victim which have turned new leads. The Detective Bureau will continue to review this case until all leads are exhausted or a suspect is identified.

Types of Cases Assigned Total of 174 cases












Police Responses to 20,645 CFS by Day of Week






Motor Vehicle Crash Reports By Month






Motor Vehicle Crash Reports

500 Accident Records in 2022






Parking Citation Type 37 Parking Citations in 2022





1395 Citations by Day of Week






Citations by Age 1395 Total Citations Issued








OFFICER INITIATED TRAFFIC STOP












1930 Offense Reports by Day of Week

Subject Arrested for Other Agencies 'Warrant without Maumee Charges










Types of Cases Assigned Total of 174 cases
