RESOLUTION NO. 001-2025

A RESOLUTION OF CITY OF MAUMEE SUPPORTING THE OHIO MUNICIPAL LEAGUE'S CHALLENGE OF AT&T'S TARIFF APPLICATION AT THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF OHIO.

On Wednesday January 22, 2025 at 5pm, the Public Information Committee held a meeting after proper notice was given to the public. In attendance were Jon Fiscus, Committee Chair; Margo Puffenberger and Scott Noonan, committee members; Phil Leinbach, council member; Patrick Burtch, city administrator; Nancy Gagnet, public information officer; Alan Lehenbauer, law director; and Valerie Giovanucci, Isiah Gonzalez, and Colleen Wittenmyer, residents.

The first item discussed was methods to increase communication to the public, specifically regarding current sewer issues/fixes. It was noted that there is an informative letter currently being formulated to be mailed to all homes in the community. The letter will provide a thorough timeline and details to further explain what steps have been taken up to this point with the city's efforts to correct sewer issues. The idea of placing a QR code on future water bills was discussed, however with limited space on the mailers, the feasibility of that idea is in question. Also discussed was ideas for information on the next quarterly citywide newsletter.

The next item discussed was the potential of using an app-service for public enhancement. This would be something similar to the Engage Toledo app. The committee was informed something like this was looked into in the past, but was found to not be a reasonable expense. A new phone system is currently being installed throughout the city offices, and it will hopefully aid with some of the communication issues, however it will be a months long process for the switch to take place.

The mayor will be repeating his State of the City address on February 4th at the Maumee Indoor Theater.

The administration is currently looking into creating a financial dashboard to be placed on the website. It would create a user friendly interface to allow easy access to city information straight from the website.

Patrick informed the committee that he is currently going back through all of the Q & A from the sewer roundtables and other meetings to make sure all of the questions have the most up to date and accurate information. There is an updated PowerPoint regarding the Sewer Grant program which should be presented to council at the next meeting for endorsement.

Meeting was adjourned at 6:21pm.

The Parks & Recreation Committee held a meeting on Tuesday, January 28 at 4pm after proper notice was given to the public. In attendance were Jon Fiscus, Committee Chair; Josh Harris and Ted Kurt, committee members; Nancy Gagnet, Public Information Officer; Patrick Burtch, City Administrator; Jennifer Harkey, Finance Director; and Ric Hardy, Maumee resident.

The first item discussed was the upcoming Rolf Park pool season. After reviewing the notes and suggestions from the outgoing pool manager, it was determined that the only necessary change for the upcoming season would be to adjust the hours of the pool. Hours will now be daily from 12:30pm until 7:30pm, a half hour earlier open and close. Rates were decided to remain the same. The city is currently searching for a new pool manager, and will be posting the job if necessary.

The city is currently awaiting the finalization of the agreement of the land purchase council approved at the last meeting. A design for a small parking lot and true entrance to the park from the new land is in the works. A boundary survey will be taking place to properly determine the outline of the park land. The city is also currently working on an agreement and drawing for a path that will sufficiently connect the park to the western portion of Arrowhead Park. A brief discussion was held regarding a potential change of name, due to negative connotation of the current name, and the Arrowhead board has stated they are not opposed to a name change in the future.

The final item on the agenda was a discussion of future ideas/goals for the parks, in both 2025 and beyond. A potential revamp to the memorial at Union Park was discussed. The city will seek out an estimate for a new fence/rail for the park perimeter, in conjunction with the new rail proposed for along that portion of Conant. The new dugouts for the back field at Ford Field are underway, as well as a revamp of the blacktop area and pathways that lead to the back field and playground. The city was awarded a grant from ODNR for a new playground at Ford Field at the end of 2024. The back dugouts at Fairfield will likely need to be replaced and could be a 2026 project. The second concession stand (closest to the turnpike) at Rolf Park will eventually need to be replaced, and a preliminary estimate puts the project around \$500k. A quote for a new sign at Rolf Park will be sought to replace the aging sign that is currently at the park. There is still a fire station project slated for the back portion of Rolf Park between the park and new apartments.

AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made this _	day of	, 20	_ by and between the Lucas County
Public Defender Commission and the C	City of Maumee.		

WHEREAS, the Board of Lucas County Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the County") has created a Public Defender Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 120.13; and

WHEREAS, the Lucas County Public Defender Commission (hereinafter referred to as "LCPDC") pursuant to Sections 120.04 and 120.13 of the Ohio Revised Code, may contract for public defender services for the legal representation of indigent persons; and

WHEREAS, the City of Maumee desires to be included within the plan for appointment of counsel in the Maumee Municipal Court pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 120.33, and

WHEREAS, the Villages of Waterville and Whitehouse desire to be included within said plan; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED:

- 1. That this contract will be in effect from January 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025.
- 2. The City of Maumee will pay "the County" Eight Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$8,700.00) for 2025. The City of Maumee shall deposit with Lucas County in March, 2025 Eight Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$8,700.00) to cover the necessary expenses and cost of counsel to represent indigent persons charged with violations of municipal ordinances of the City of Maumee, the City of Waterville, the Village of Swanton, the Maumee Tax Department, and the Village of Whitehouse, which could result in the indigent's loss of liberty upon conviction.
- 3. The Lucas County Public Defender Commission (LCPDC) agrees that it will require the Toledo Legal Aid Society to furnish, upon request, to the City, on a quarterly basis, a list of criminal charges filed. Said list shall include the name of the indigents for whom representation was provided, the violation or violations with which the indigents have been charged, and the Municipal Court case numbers of said charges.
- 4. The LCPDC, at the City's request, agrees to review the Toledo Legal Aid Society operations and budget with the City.

- 5. It is further agreed that the contract shall be reviewed each year after July 1 and after October 1 in light of any standards that may be imposed by the State Public Defender Commission and to determine whether the advances called for under the contract are sufficient or insufficient for the purpose intended.
- 6. The Judge of the Maumee Municipal Court agrees to coordinate "Public Defender" day(s) for the Maumee Municipal Court with the Executive Director of the Toledo Legal Aid Society and the Judges of the Sylvania and Oregon Municipal Courts.
- 7. The Maumee Municipal Court agrees to furnish the LCPDC its latest completed annual report with a breakdown of cases by jurisdiction, which may be used as a factor for future public defender contracts.
- 8. Reimbursement by the City of Maumee for representation of such indigent persons may be by a contractual amount or a fee schedule, however, in either event such reimbursement shall not exceed the fee schedule in effect and adopted by the Lucas County Commissioners.
- 9. This Agreement shall provide for conformity with the standards of indigency and other rules and standards established by the Ohio Public Defender Commission and the State Public Defender.
- 10. Pursuant to OAC 120-1-72 (7), this contract provides that the Toledo Legal Aid Society shall compensate its staff employees, subcontractors and retained forensic experts at rates commensurate with their training, experience, responsibilities, and compensation paid to persons doing similar work in public agencies in the jurisdiction.
- 11. The Toledo Legal Aid Society shall provide that counsel under contract shall be available to eligible defendants at their request or the request of someone acting on their behalf as required by law, including but not limited to at police questioning, arraignment, formal charging, or indictment.120-1-12(E)(11).
- 12. The contract shall provide that the Toledo Legal Aid Society maintain a case reporting and management information system from which data shall be available and provided to the Lucas County Public Defender Commission or state public defender upon request. 120-1-12(E)(13).
- 13. The Lucas County Public Defender Commission shall report the caseload data required by the Ohio Public Defender when submitting its monthly request for reimbursement. 120-1-12(E)(13).
- 14. Any such system shall be maintained independently from client files so as to disclose no privileged information. The case reporting and management information system shall be used to provide the Toledo Legal Aid Society, the Lucas County Public Defender Commission, and the Ohio Public

Defender Commission with caseload information sufficient to ensure compliance with the Ohio Public Defender Commission's rules, Chapter 120 of the Revised Code, and the Ohio public defender standards and guidelines 120-1-12(E)(13).

A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING FEBRUARY 9th-15th 2025 AS OHIO LOVES TRANSIT WEEK

Now, therefore, be it Resolved by the Council of the City of Maumee, Lucas County, State of Ohio as follows:

Section 1.

- (1) That February 9th-15th 2025 is hereby designated as Ohio Loves Transit Week in the City of Maumee;
 - (2) The City of Maumee recognizes the significance of transit to our community;
- (3) The City of Maumee recognizes the important role TARTA, and its organization play in providing transit opportunities to our citizens;
 - (4) The City of Maumee supports TARTA and all transit efforts in our community;

Section 2. ORDINANCE NO. 003 - 2025

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CODIFIED ORDINANCE SECTION 921.14 AND ORDINANCE 058-2022 RELATIVE TO A SENIOR CITIZEN/DISABILITY WATER AND SEWER DISCOUNT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, Maumee has previously adopted Codified Ordinance Section 921.14 and Ordinance 058-2022 and,

WHEREAS, in order to modify certain provisions of Codified Ordinance Section 921.14 and Ordinance 058-2022 so discounts for certain water and sewer customers can be increased, this Codified Ordinance should be amended;

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Maumee finds that this financial assistance program would be for a public purpose as defined by Ohio law; that the actions taken would be for the general good of the residents of the City of Maumee; promotes the public health and general welfare of the City of Maumee; and serves a public purpose by providing support for the individuals who benefit from this program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Maumee, Ohio, that:

SECTION 1.Codified Ordinance Section 921.14 and Ordinance 058-2022 be, and the same hereby are amended in part as follows:

921.14 SENIOR CITIZEN/DISABILITY DISCOUNT PROGRAM.

Starting March 1, 2025, there will be a Water and Sewer Discount Program providing a thirty dollar (\$30) total credit per quarter on Water and Sewer billing for qualifying residential customers who own their residence. This is offered to qualifying individuals sixty-five (65) years of age and older and adult property owners with a disability as determined by Social Security. The individual applying must own the residence, have a current or new water account with Maumee, and meet household income requirements for said discount. Residential Customers must complete the discount application each year with proof of residency, household income and/or a copy of the social security disability award if applicable. Official forms, such as Driver's License, State ID, or other forms will have to be provided for verification to receive the thirty dollar (\$30) quarterly discount or credit. The household income requirements for each year of this program will be based upon Two Hundred Twenty Five Percent (225%) of the current Federal poverty level. which said levels may change annually. The current rates are as follows:

Household Size	200% Federal Poverty Level
1	\$35,213
2	\$47,588
3	\$59,963
4	\$72,338

The Finance Director and/or City Administrator are hereby authorized to adjust the household income requirements for future years based upon then current Federal Poverty Guidelines.

SECTION 2. That Codified Ordinance Section 921.14, Ordinance 058-2022, and any other water rules as the same are currently written be, and the same hereby are, amended to reflect the foregoing changes and any provisions in said Ordinances, Codified Ordinances or Rules inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including the Maumee Charter.

RESOLUTION NO. 003 -2025

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURE OF PUBLIC FUNDS FOR LUCAS COUNTY-MAUMEE VALLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

WHEREAS, the City of Maumee has financially supported the Lucas County-Maumee Valley Historical Society located within the City of Maumee;

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Maumee wishes to appropriate and provide, if necessary, limited funds in support of this entity in 2025 and finds that the expenditure of funds for this entity and use of city resources by this entity would be for a public purpose as defined by Ohio law; that the expenditure would be for the general good of the residents of the City of Maumee; promotes the public health and general welfare of the City of Maumee; and serves a public purpose by providing additional resources for the operation of this entity;

WHEREAS, guidelines shall be established and enforced to ensure proper information is provided by the Lucas County-Maumee Valley Historical Society for proper expenditure of these funds and proper accounting for use of these funds and that the Lucas County-Maumee Valley Historical Society is in compliance with City of Maumee Ordinances, City of Maumee policy and guidelines for charitable organizations and State and Federal Law;

WHEREAS, the Finance Director and or City Administrator are hereby authorized to withhold said funds or require repayment of said funds if not appropriately spent or accounted for by the Lucas County-Maumee Valley Historical Society

WHEREAS, the provisions of funds for any organization in future years shall continue to be evaluated and determined by council in future years.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council for the City of Maumee, Ohio, that:

SECTION 1. That the City Council of the City of Maumee, Ohio, hereby authorizes the Finance Director to provide funds for the Lucas County-Maumee Valley Historical Society, in 2025, in an amount not to exceed the request made by the Lucas County-Maumee Valley Historical Society. The use of the funds provided shall be in accordance with Ohio law, the conditions set forth herein, and the guidelines adopted by the law director for expenditure of said funds and the conduct of the organization receiving any funds.

SECTION 2. If any section, phrase, sentence, or portion of this Resolution is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

SECTION 3. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including the Maumee Charter.




